
Young Girl's Life Saved Thanks to Doctor's Persistence








National and Regional Recognition

CRMC was honored repeatedly during FY23 and FY24 for both patient experience and clinical excellence. Among the most prestigious awards:













In 2022, the Minneapolis Star Tribune named CRMC Minnesota's Best in several categories, including Best Hospital, Best Orthopaedic Surgeon, Best Surgery Center, and Best Nursing Home. Local pride was also reflected in the Brainerd Dispatch's Best of the Brainerd Lakes awards, where CRMC earned #1 Best Medical Facility in both 2022 and 2023, and #1 Best Healthcare Provider in

Advancing Our Services

We continued to expand access to care and specialty services throughout FY23 and FY24:

- Endocrinology launched with the addition of Dr. Berquist, broadening our ability to support patients with diabetes, thyroid disorders, and other hormone-related conditions.
- ERCP (Endoscopic Retrograde Cholangiopancreatography) services were introduced under the leadership of Dr. Kelly, offering advanced diagnosis and treatment for gastrointestinal conditions.
- Our Spine program welcomed Dr. Stokman, expanding surgical care for back and neck conditions.
- The Intracept Procedure, a minimally invasive option for chronic vertebrogenic back pain, became available in our Pain Management clinic.
- A new SIM Man training system enhanced hands-on learning for clinical teams, supporting a culture of safety and continuous improvement.

Investing in Quality and Innovation

CRMC's clinical excellence was further validated by key accreditations and awards:

- Designated a DNV (Det Norske Veritas®) Center of Excellence in FY24 an achievement that reflects rigorous adherence to best practices and exceptional outcomes in patient care.
- Continued certification from The Joint Commission, Commission on Cancer, and other national bodies reinforced our commitment to evidence-based care.

In FY23, CRMC also launched the inaugural CRMC Championship, a community golf event that has since become a signature fundraiser supporting local healthcare initiatives.

Strengthening Our Communities

As part of our mission to support health beyond our hospital walls, CRMC received the Minnesota Hospital Association's Community Benefit Award for efforts to combat food insecurity—a reflection of our broader commitment to addressing the social determinants of health.



Community Benefit

At CRMC, we are deeply committed to enhancing the well-being of our community through a comprehensive range of programs and activities that promote health, healing, and access to care. Guided by insights from our Community Health Needs Assessment, we focus on addressing the most pressing health issues, including mental health, physical activity, and nutrition. Our initiatives aim to improve community health by increasing access to healthcare services and fostering a holistic environment of well-being.



We collaborate closely with community members, local organizations, and public health departments to understand and address the unique needs and strengths of our community. Our community benefit programs are designed to provide treatment and promote health and healing in direct response to these needs. These initiatives are crucial in enhancing access to healthcare and improving overall community health.

Each year, CRMC strengthens our commitment to the community by providing health-related education through a variety of events, seminars, support groups, and wellness screenings. We also collaborate with other non-profit organizations that share our mission to improve the community's health and well-being. Ensuring access to affordable healthcare for all community members is one of our top priorities.

CRMC is dedicated to offering charity care to all qualifying patients and provides subsidized services to ensure healthcare remains accessible to everyone in the community.

Supporting our communities

CRMC Addresses Food Insecurities

From skyrocketing grocery prices making it harder to put meals on the table to the lack of access to fresh, healthy fruits and veggies, the need in our community is immense. During the Community Health Needs Assessment, many of our neighbors identified that they were feeling the impact.

From April 2023 to March 2024, Cuyuna Regional Medical Center (CRMC) was steadfast in its mission to improve food security. With a clear focus on increasing fruit and vegetable consumption and reducing obesity rates among its patients, the medical facility implemented a range of strategies. Those included employee volunteer hours, increased cash donations, and community-based activities, all aimed at directly benefiting those in need.

CRMC employees volunteered in various settings, including the local food shelf and serving meals at the community table. To address food insecurity for children during the summer, CRMC partnered with area churches to provide nutritious meals to youth who relied on free and reduced meals during the school year. The Cuyuna Lakes Lunch Bunch established multiple drop sites, ensuring students in different communities were fed. In total, over 1,600 meals were made.

Additionally, different departments at the medical facility sponsored mini food pantries monthly, filling three pantries one to two times weekly. The mini pantries allowed families, or any community resident, to grab items with no questions asked. Recognizing the need among seniors, CRMC teamed up with Catholic Charities to offer nutritious frozen meals that seniors in Crow Wing County could pick up monthly. In the span of 12 months, 17,214 meals were distributed.

CRMC's commitment to serving those in need is unwavering. From providing free meals at community events to distributing food bags and pantry packs, our efforts are ongoing. We understand that the needs in our community are persistent, with a county poverty rate of 10.7%, and we are dedicated to meeting these challenges head-on.


